

Amazon assessment test questions and answers

Amazon's hiring process often includes both behavioral interviews and technical assessments, and the exact nature of the assessments may vary depending on the role.

Behavioral Interviews

For most roles at Amazon, you can expect questions based on Amazon's 14 Leadership Principles. You may be asked to provide examples of times when you've demonstrated customer obsession, ownership, long-term thinking, etc. Using the STAR (Situation, Task, Action, Result) method to structure your answers can be helpful here.

Technical Assessments

If you're applying for a technical role, you might be assessed on coding, data structures, algorithms, system design, or other relevant skills. You can practice coding problems on platforms like LeetCode, HackerRank, or Codewars.

Other Assessments

For some roles, Amazon might also administer tests like:

- Situational Judgment Tests: These assess how you might respond to hypothetical, job-related situations.
- Numerical Reasoning Tests: These assess your ability to interpret numerical data, graphs, or statistics.
- Verbal Reasoning Tests: These assess your ability to understand and interpret written information.

Tips for Preparation

- A) Understand the Role: Make sure you understand the specific requirements of the position and tailor your preparation accordingly.
- B) Practice, Practice, Practice: Use online resources to practice the types of questions you might encounter. This is especially important for technical roles where coding or problem-solving assessments are common.
- C) Use Amazon's Resources: If Amazon provides any preparation materials, make sure to review them.
- D) Focus on the Leadership Principles: Amazon places a strong emphasis on its Leadership Principles, so be ready to discuss how you embody them in your work.
- E) Stay Calm and Take Your Time: If you're unsure about a question, don't rush. Take a moment to think it through.
